- Be sure to sing and say and pray your parts too as you stand and sit. Your children learn by following your lead.


If you and your child must leave, please hurry back. We want your children here so much that we didn't build a nursery. Like Jesus, we want your children in the Liturgy, not out.

who spoke by the prophets.





Our Communion Statement



SWD Teacher of the Year Program

You can nominate **Directors and Early Childhood Teachers in Freestanding Preschools** through the SWD website swd.lcms.org/ministries/schools/educator-year until November 1. To be eligible to compete for this program, teachers must be nominated by students, parents, other teachers, community members, or administrators. Because the program's purpose is to recognize the contributions of Wisconsin classroom teachers. staff members whose assignments are administrative or supervisory are not eligible. All PreK-12 classroom teachers who plan to continue teaching in their current capacity for a minimum of 50% full time equivalency during the 2021-2022 school year are eligible to be considered for the 2021 Teacher of the Year Program. Preschool teachers must teach in a Pre-K program that is NOT affiliated with an elementary school. Previous fellowship recipients are ineligible, however previous fellowship applicants who did not receive a fellowship may re-apply if nominated. Nominations must be submitted by **Sunday**, November 1.
